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BENEFITS AND DUES STRUCTURE FOR NNPRFTC MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM – PHASE I

BACKGROUND:

Overall strategy – Here’s where we are headed as an organization – we are building our future leaders and current influencers. We need to support the movement of postgraduate training and attract the next generation of leaders. Membership is not limited to accredited organizations or program directors, but open to all that support our mission and vision.

Bifurcated organization – NNPRFTC supports and promotes the belief that postgrad residency is fundamental to promoting innovation and dissemination of best practices and new information. It is fundamental to the future of healthcare and to leading the way, nationally, regionally and locally. As such, there are two unique, but related arms of the Consortium: Accreditation and Membership. Accreditation provides a national mechanism to acknowledge programmatic quality while establishing standards of excellence that promote consistency in postgraduate training. Membership provides formal and informal mechanisms to encourage and support the those involved in the postgraduate residency training movement. Through membership the two strands come together.

Value Proposition: Membership activities focus upon building collaborative, life-long learning opportunities that focus on leadership, evidence-based practice, innovation in care delivery, and ethics in health care. Through networking, establishing and sharing best practices, voluntary peer-reviewed accreditation, and targeted opportunities for career development, the Consortium is building the current and future NP leadership in healthcare training, practice, administration, and research.

Eligibility for Membership: NNPRFTC’s Bylaws specify eligibility for membership as follows:

“To qualify as an Individual Member (a “Qualified Individual”), an individual must demonstrate a commitment to advancing the development, spread, and sustainability of post-graduate nurse practitioner residency and fellowship training programs for new nurse practitioners.

To qualify as an Institutional Member (a “Qualified Institution”), an institution (such as, but not limited to, a federally qualified health center, a nurse managed health center, a health system, a hospital [or program]) must demonstrate a commitment to advancing the development, spread, and sustainability of post-graduate nurse practitioner residency and fellowship training programs.”

BENEFITS FOR MEMBERS (INSTITUTIONAL AND INDIVIDUAL) FOR PHASE 1

1. Acknowledge membership by listing on public-facing website: Individual – Name, credentials, organization and state; Institutional—Organization name and state
2. Membership directory/access for members only (full listing of contact information)
3. Opportunity to participate in professional learning community:
 - a. Networking
 - b. Special interest group / discussion platforms in response to member requests. Topics/focus might include: accreditation; program directors; trainees; researchers (novice and experienced); administrative leadership
 - c. Participate in periodic General Membership Virtual Meetings
 - d. Access to topical ‘toolboxes’ offering resources shared by members for curriculum development, program evaluation, preparation for accreditation, etc.
4. Access to expanded website listing of relevant publications/citations (including: DNP, PhD projects/research that pertain to NP practice, training, and leadership)

ADDITIONAL BENEFITS FOR INSTITUTIONAL MEMBERS FOR PHASE 1

1. Availability of sponsorship opportunities at NNPRFTC sponsored events
2. Two individual memberships: one for a program director and one other
3. Trainee Recruitment: Detailed postgrad training program profiles & link to training program (to be developed in 2019)
